The Top Ten Emerging Health Care Trends helps delineate today's most critical changes, identify trends that are inter-related, and identify opportunities for pharmacy leaders, including educators, to reshape their organizations to meet today's and tomorrow's challenges.

This presentation presents the results of a survey that identifies and links these changes, and suggests ways pharmacy educators can prepare the leaders of tomorrow.

# Methodology

The 10 trends described in this program were the result first of a collation of public opinion in secondary sources obtained through a targeted literature review on emerging health care trends impacting managed care pharmacy. An advisory panel was organized to validate trends from the public domain, identify and prioritize the most important trends (through a series of ranking exercises and a live workshop), and provide insight on implications across health care stakeholders. This project sought to contemplate forcing factors that drive the current trends and potential new developments.
