

Mentee Bio:

Hello! My name is Jenn Yoon. I'm originally from Florida but moved to Washington for pharmacy school. Why all the way in Washington you may ask? Because it was something scary, unfamiliar, and new, and for those reasons it just felt right. UWSOP also has a unique opportunity for students to be able to complete both a PharmD and MBA at the same time, which I gladly took advantage of. Why pharmacy and business together? Something I appreciate about pharmacists is that they are perhaps the humblest of all healthcare providers. Working tirelessly to provide exceptional care to patients and always working in the background to ensure their safety, but never needing recognition for the hard work put in. I truly believe that pharmacists are the backbone of the healthcare system and are the reason why patient care has evolved into what it is now. Additionally, learning about business has given me even greater insight into how the real world really works. Money and business are the source of all problems and all solutions. They are the rate-limiting factors in how the healthcare system is able to overcome obstacles and provide effective, safe, but also affordable care for our patients. Managed care pharmacists have both this humility and deep insight to be able to make these appropriate and necessary healthcare decisions. Embracing the unknown leads to personal growth and development, and allows you to discover new skills and passions, and gain valuable insights.

I appreciate the endless support and encouragement I receive from Erin. She is so extremely patient with me and continues to always lift me up when I am being hard on myself. Her calm demeanor and inviting presence help me feel secure in myself, and like I am never alone in this journey. After each meeting I have with her, she never fails to make me feel more motivated and excited for my future. I am so extremely appreciative of her and having her as my mentor. It was the best decision I have ever made throughout my time in pharmacy school to reach out to her.

Jenn is very accountable and proactive. She takes ownership of her responsibilities and consistently follows through on her commitments, which has been instrumental in achieving goals.
